Shotgun

Fall 2024 Crawford County Shotgun Shooting Sports will shoot as weather and time permit. Scheduled dates, times and locations are to be determined and vary. It is recommended the 4-H'er signs up and communicates with the instructor. A text group will then be created with participants. New shooters must attend the range and safety orientation to participate in the program. Most of the time we will shoot American trap. Other disciplines could include skeet, sporting clays, or 5stand. We have two shotguns available to use (Remington 870 - 20ga), however, if you own your own shotgun you are welcome to bring it (.410, 28ga, 20g, 16ga, or 12ga). Instructional rounds (20ga) and targets will be provided (amount of instructional rounds vary with each 4-H'er). Any additional shooting will require you to bring your own ammo and pay for the targets. For example: if you choose to shoot a round of 25 it would cost you your own box of shells plus \$0.20/target x 25 targets = \$5.00. Ear and eye protection is required at all times when on the range.
